The Bible States In Genesis 2: 7-8; 18-24

Ge 2:7 the LORD God formed the man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being.

Ge 2:8 Now the LORD God had planted a garden in the east, in Eden; and there he put the man he had formed.

Ge 2:18 The LORD God said, “It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him.”

Ge 2:19 Now the LORD God had formed out of the ground all the beasts of the field and all the birds of the air. He brought them to the man to see what he would name them; and whatever the man called each living creature, that was its name.

Ge 2:20 So the man gave names to all the livestock, the birds of the air and all the beasts of the field. But for Adam no suitable helper was found.

Marriage is God's way in relationships when more intimate closeness and life is desired. Although, once this choice is made in its formal way, it cannot be undone except with very few godly options. This has to be taken into account before the vows and the life that follows afterward.

Although we cannot make our mate like our villain attempted to do, I believe God has that special someone in store for anyone that will pray in faith and is God's will to marry someone.
