Pr 24:19 Do not fret because of evil men or be  
envious of the wicked,

Pr 24:20 for the evil man has no future hope,  
and the lamp of the wicked will be snuffed out.

Pr 24:21 Fear the LORD and the king, my son,  
and do not join with the rebellious,

Pr 24:22 for those two will send sudden destruction upon them, and who knows what calamities they can bring?
